Historical Performance Major Concentrations include: harpsichord, fortepiano, organ, historical keyboard instruments, baroque violin, baroque viola, baroque cello, viola da gamba, baroque cello and viola da gamba, historical flutes, historical oboes, recorder.

<sup>1</sup> BM students typically begin study in historical performance on a secondary instrument in their 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

<sup>2</sup> Either APST 214/215 or APST 240/341 is required for students whose graduate historical performance concentration includes any historical keyboard instrument. The student must complete one of these pairs of classes: APST 240/341 or APST 214/215. Other historical performance instruments may fill the credits with electives.

<sup>3</sup> One semester of French, German, or Italian is required. This requirement may be waived by examination and official waiver application. It is expected that students will pass a departmental examination of reading proficiently in French, German, or Italian in their 4<sup>th</sup> year.

4 PROF 140/141 is only required of students whose graduate major concentration includes harpsichord. Other historical performance instruments may fill the credits with electives.

5 Historical Performance Ensembles may be filled with the following courses: APST 730 (Collegium Musicum), APST 745 (Baroque Orchestra), APST 841 (Viola da Gamba Consort), APST 843 (Baroque Ensemble), or APST 844 (Renaissance Recorder Ensemble).

- 6 Students are expected to have demonstrated baccalaureate competence in music history and music theory before enrollment for the lecture recital; the lecture recital cannot take place in the same semester as the master's recital.
- 7 Additional non-course requirements include the Recital Hearing, Keyboard Proficiency, and Language Proficiency. The recital hearing must be completed before the Master's Recital. The Keyboard Proficiency is required of non-keyboard majors. Requirement may be satisfied by passing a proficiency exam or taking an appropriate course in consultation with the keyboard faculty. The Language Proficiency requirement is an Exam demonstrating reading proficiency in French, German, or Italian.
- 8 The Comprehensive exam is an oral examination that is intended to cover the breadth of their studies in HP Typically completed in the last semester of study.
